## February is American Heart Month

According to the Center for Disease Control, heart disease has been the leading cause of death in the United States since 1950. With so many people at risk for developing life-threatening heart disease, American Heart Month, which takes place each February, was created to educate and inspire people to take action to avoid becoming a statistic.

Ways to lessen your risk for heart disease include:

- Increase exercise, particularly aerobic or “cardio” exercise.
- Eat a healthy diet low in cholesterol.
- If you’re smoking, work toward stopping.
- Stress is a major factor in many cases of heart disease. Decreasing stress helps lessen your risk.



iServe Nebraska is a convenient new way for Nebraskans to apply to receive benefits such as food, utilities, healthcare, childcare, and other essential needs. Nebraskans can apply for a single benefit, or several at the same time.

While you can apply through iServe Nebraska online, not everyone has access to devices and a dependable internet connection. To that end, the kiosks in our area will allow everyone to take advantage of this service. The kiosks provide information in English and Spanish.
